Ingrid Rimland Zundel, Ed.D., is the author of several books including the award-winning The Wanderers, a semi-autobiographical account of her family's experience as Mennonite refugees after World War II. Born in the Ukraine, she lived in Paraguay before ultimately coming to the U.S., where she graduated magna cum laude from Wichita State University in 1971. She received her Ed.D. from University of the Pacific. She began operating a website devoted to historical revisionism in 1995; and in 2000 she married Ernst Zundel, currently imprisoned in Germany for his speech.

Michael A. Hoffman II was educated at the State University of New York at Oswego. He is a former reporter for the New York bureau of the Associated Press and author of six books, including Secret Societies and Psychological Warfare and The Great Holocaust Trial. He was for a time affiliated with the Eastern Pennsylvania Mennonite Church at Waterloo, New York, and later resided in Amish settlements at Prattsburgh, NY and Libby, MT. He currently serves as executive editor of Independent History and Research, a publishing house, and as a consultant to the Baruch Spinoza Institute, an evangelical association of Judaic converts to Christianity. He and his wife are the parents of ten children.
